

What type of documents need to get notarized before I can apostille or authenticate them?

Any type of document that does not appear in the official records of any government office or in publicly recorded records of a governing body is considered a non-recordable document by the Texas Secretary of State.

You will need to hire us or use another Texas notary public to properly notarize your non-recordable documents before you can mail or drop off your documents at our Austin, TX office to apostille.

Non-recordable documents are legal documents such as power of attorneys, wills, trusts, lease agreements, K-12, high school or college degrees, diplomas, transcripts, or records, affidavits of single status, contracts, leases, translation and translated documents, consent forms, travel forms, utility bills, bill of sales, agreements, veterans affairs benefits letters, social security benefits letters, EIN confirmation letters, shipping records, immigration and adoption paperwork, and ID photocopies like driver's licenses, passports, passport cards, permanent resident cards (Green cards), visas, and social security cards.
